Tragedy in Virginia Beach

On May 31st a gunman walked into Building 2 of the Virginia Beach Municipal Complex and began shooting.

Twelve people were murdered and 4 more injured before police were able to kill the suspect. As I listened to the news reports over the next couple of days, here is what stood out to me.



The timeline of the shooting indicates that the first shots were fired about 4:00 PM in the parking lot. From there, the shooter entered the building and began firing indiscriminately on all 3 floors of the building. At 4:08 PM the first reports of a man shot in the parking lot go out to police. Police arrive on scene at 4:09 PM and enter the building at 4:12 PM. At 4:43 Police shoot the suspect and take him into custody. The entire incident took 43 minutes and it was a full 120 minutes before hospitals started confirming the arrival of victims. Even with Virginia Beach Police, Sheriff, Fire and EMS all within 1/2 mile of the shooting, it still took 12 minutes for first responders to alter actions of the shooter.

Last month we discussed the University of NC and Colorado STEM school shooting and the heroic actions of two students who died while trying to stop a gunman in their school. Not only did they save the lives of their classmates, but by confronting the shooter, they also increased their chances of survival. Active Shooters have a much higher injury and death rate than criminals and law enforcement combined, because their victims are usually lying on the floor and the killer simply shoots them at point blank range. Countering a mass shooter can be extremely dangerous, but there are techniques that can give you a better chance at saving your own life.

Banning Suppressors?



As you might have heard in the news reports from the Virginia Beach shooting, the suspect reportedly used a "silencer" during his rampage. Despite numerous reports of police and people running to and away from the sounds of gunfire. The media has since suggested that the "silencer", technically a sound "suppressor", should be similarly banned as

the bump stock was earlier this year. In a recent interview on his overseas trip to Europe, President Trump stated "We're Going to Seriously Look" At Banning Suppressors.

However, unlike bump stocks, suppressors have HUGE benefits to the shooting community and been HEAVILY regulated since the passage of the NFA in 1934.

Contrary to what you see in movies, suppressors DO NOT silence gun fire! The effects and benefits of suppressors are conveniently explained in a recent diagram created by Brownells. While you may not have a need for a Bump Stock or Suppressor, and don't particularly care if one or both are banned, it is this type of incrementalism that has Pro 2nd Amendment advocates on edge. When anti-gun groups, politicians and lawmakers, who have no knowledge or limited knowledge (based solely on media reports and movies), suggest banning legal products it should be concerning to all.

Those of us that oppose "common sense gun reform" such as "Assault Weapons Bans" or "Universal Background Checks" don't oppose them because we are "OK" with Mass Shooting and Gun Crimes, we oppose them because the people proposing the changes have NO CLUE what they are talking about. This is why education is the key to saving our 2nd Amendment. Colion Noir had it right in his video called Gun Owners Unite! All gun owners (hunters, collectors, plinkers, competition shooters, and self-defense advocates) must unite if we intend to protect our 2nd Amendment.

Lessons Learned From Watching 12,000 Gun Fights!

That was the title of John Correia's seminar at last month's USCCA Concealed Carry Expo in Pittsburgh, PA. I was familiar with John's YouTube Channel called Active Self Protection, and have watched it over the years, but this was the first time I got to hear him speak publicly. His presentation was excellent and hit on many of the same topics we have heard from veteran trainers around the country. Here is just a few of the observations he has made while watching 12,000 gun fights!

- Your training must be recent, relevant, and
- realistic! ■ Most gun fights happen in transitional spaces that allows attackers to prey on potential victims with

Α fast reliable draw with first shots on

is the critical skill needed to win the gunfight. ■ Most gunfights happen between 3 and 7 yards, or as Tom Givens states at about а car length distance. ■ Followup shots are very often necessary regardless of handgun caliber. ■ You simply WILL NOT stand still while someone is trying to

target

kill you, SO learning to move with purpose is critical. *Chasing deadly threats is another bad habit that is seen all the time!

John finishes up with this statement.

"If there's one lesson that I have learned again...
and again...and again from moderating comments on
social media from people watching my lessons, it's the
sheer number of people who are woefully, terribly
misinformed and uninformed about the legal and moral
aspects of using deadly force."

Range work will include instruction in the use of the defensive handgun under extreme stress. Drawing from concealment, two-handed stances, shooting from cover, one-handed stances with either hand, speed reloading, and more are taught with an overall emphasis on fast, accurate shot placement.
